General

The Gathering will take place from 20–23 July 2024 inclusive — 20–21 July in Lochalsh and 22–23 July on the Isle of Skye. Please make special note that the plan may yet vary a little; if our numbers fluctuate or circumstances change.

Note 1. Calum Mackenzie's boat trip, Sat 20 July.

I have made a provisional private booking of Calum's boat for a 1 hour trip from Plockton. This is a tour out into Loch Carron with local history and other wildlife commentary, and includes a visit to see the seals.

- Max 40 passengers.
- It will cost in the region of £12–16 per seat, depending on the number of takers; I could ask for a second trip if numbers are good.
- Presently the booking is for 5.00pm but it should be possible to move that timing forward or back by one hour if that suits a majority.
- Please communicate your level of interest in this boat trip to your Chief's Lieutenant, so I know what to organise.
- To help your planning, the drive from the Lochcarron Games at Attadale to Plockton takes about 30 minutes, or you could get the train from Attadale to Plockton (only four per day, the relevant one being 3.37pm from Attadale; it takes 25 minutes; watch out for summer timetable changes!).
- NB This trip is weather dependent; it will not run if the weather is bad; so \(\begin{aligned} \begin{aligned} \\ \\ \\ \end{aligned} \).

Note 2. Clan Parliament, Mon 22 July

This will be a chaired and minuted meeting in the Portree Gathering Hall for anyone attending our Clan Gathering, to discuss items of clan interest. An agenda will be available on the day.

All members of the Clan Society and their invited guests are welcome. It is not a public meeting.

Costs

Clan Society members should organise their own accommodation and transport, sharing as desired.

Please plan to share cars wherever possible during the four days of our Gathering. Many West Highland and Hebridean roads are small and narrow. This is particularly true on the Isle of Skye; numbers of vehicles sometime outstrip parking capacity.

I anticipate two Gathering charges. Both will be collected centrally by each Branch and transferred to the UK Branch before the Gathering takes place.

- 1. **Participation charge**. £15 per person aged 16 or over who attends a Clan event at any time during the Gathering; this is a one-off charge to cover all Gathering administrative costs.
- 2. **Clan drinks party charge**. Mon 22 July Portree Gathering Hall. This charge is to cover the cost of the food. All attending should bring whatever drinks they wish to consume themselves; this is to avoid a costly alcohol licence and bar staff.
 - £30 per adult.
 - £10 per child under 12.
 - Free for children under 4.
 - Fizzy water and squash included.
 - · Glasses provided.

Members of the Clan will be expected to pay for themselves as necessary for entrance to the Lochcarron Games, Talisker Distillery, Dunvegan Castle, Calum Mackenzie's boat trip etc.

There is no charge for the guided walks round Balmacara Estate Coastal Path, tea at Nell Matheson's house in Duirinish, or the car tours on Skye (less entry to Dunvegan Castle).

NB. There is no obligation to attend all events, but I shall be delighted if you do.

Numbers

I will be asking Chief's Lieutenants for an update on their numbers in early March, and monthly thereafter as the Gathering approaches.

It is most important that Clan Society members keep their Chief's Lieutenant, not me, informed of their intentions so that planning can be done accurately. I will be asking them to detail which events each person intends to attend, so please consider the programme carefully.

Accommodation

Book early! Short-let rentals often get booked up quickly for the high season (May-August). NB I recommend that you get organised sooner rather than later. Possible websites include:

Or you might want to go to a hotel. Worth looking at https://www.booking.com or similar.

I recommend that you do an online comparison of <u>2024</u> accommodation, menu and bar prices before booking. Some establishments in Lochalsh have become highly priced.

If you are wondering whether or not to find different accommodation for the Lochalsh and Skye phases, my recommendation is that you should. The car journey (there is no rail link) between the Kyle of Lochalsh and Portree is approximately 1 hour. While this journey is certainly feasible, you may not wish to do it 4 times in 2 days, and anyway Portree itself is a most picturesque and enjoyable place to spend time.

If you are renting a self-catering property and wish to buy food, there is a good Co-op in Kyle and a Spar shop in Balmacara. On Skye, there are first class Co-ops in Portree and Broadford.

Getting to Lochalsh and Isle of Skye

Air

The closest airport is Inverness, from which you can either get a bus/train into Inverness if you want to use the Inverness-Kyle of Lochalsh railway, or hire a car and drive to Kyle. There are more air connections to Glasgow, the next nearest airport, but it is a longer road journey from there to Kyle.

Car hire

It is easy to hire from Inverness airport (Dalcross) or Inverness railway station, but you might also be lucky with:

Rail

The quickest rail journey would be to get a train to Inverness (main line service from anywhere in the UK). From Inverness, you could either change to the Kyle of Lochalsh line (a famous scenic journey and one to be savoured) or hire a car (approximately 2 hours). Or you could travel to Glasgow which has more travel links from the rest of the UK, but it is a longer car journey from Glasgow to Kyle (approximately 4 hrs).

If you have time to spend in Inverness railway station, keep an eye out for the memorial tablet on a wall, which names the Directors of the railway company which pushed the line through in the late century (chairman Sir Alexander Matheson) and for photographs in the waiting room of Duncraig station in the 1900s.

Lochcarron Games, Attadale

This will be the first day of our Gathering. The Games are held in the park beside Attadale House, owned by Mathesons until the 1920s. We will have our own tent in the park as a focal point. We need to arrive punctually (see programme above).

In order to avoid the congestion and delays of 2023, this year the gates will open at 09.30am. For planning purposes, please allow time to get in, share cars where possible, and aim to arrive at our tent **before** 10.00am for registration.

At 10.30am we will do a clan photograph. Events start at 11.00am and we will march on as a clan behind the pipe band at 12.00am.

Tickets. Members of the Clan Society are responsible for getting their own tickets for the Games. Adult will pay £10 each; children aged 16 and under get free entry. There is no additional parking fee.

I urge everyone to buy their tickets online beforehand via

https://www.lochcarrongames.org.uk in order to speed your passage through the gate which was the bottleneck last year. Website ticket sales will be available within the next few weeks. If you need to buy tickets at the gate on the day, they will be available, but for CASH ONLY.

Attadale is a halt on the Inverness – Kyle railway line. The park where the Games are held is a short walk from the halt.

At our last attendance at the Games, Clan Matheson acquitted itself remarkably well in the Hill Race and other athletic events, so please encourage those who would like to take part. See https://www.lochcarrongames.org.uk for information as it comes out.

Food is available from stalls all day.

There will be a number of stalls selling clan merchandise. Check carefully for accuracy before buying (last time there were several items, e.g. wrong motto on clan badges, ill-designed clan badges, spelling mistakes).

Lochcarron Weavers https://www.lochcarron.co.uk is a reputable firm which will have a stand at the Games. The manager, Joy Moran, has agreed to give a 10% discount on any items from their website to any Clan Matheson supporter, as long as an order is placed before the end of February 2024. Quote "Clan Matheson" and use her personal email joy@lochcarron.com She will arrange for items to be packed and taken to their stall at the Lochcarron Games on Sat 20 July 2024, so that you can collect from there; or you could make your own delivery arrangement with her. NB this will be a private arrangement between Lochcarron Weavers and clan members, the Clan Society will not be involved.

Transfer from Lochalsh to Portree at the end of Day 2

From the Lochcarron Games to Portree is 84 km by road; the journey will take about 75 minutes.

Skye is joined to the mainland at Kyle by a major road bridge – no toll to pay and no ferry required.

The railway terminus is at Kyle; there is no rail link to Portree.

There is a bus service (see link above).

Clan merchandise

The Secretary/Treasurer UK Branch will shortly be issuing detailed information about items of clan merchandise for sale to members attending.

Weather

It's best to plan on wet weather and be pleasantly surprised if the sun shines. Work on the old saying "There is no such thing as bad weather, only inadequate clothing". Midges can be a nuisance; insect repellent is advisable and perhaps a midge net to cover your head and hat down to neck level; if you don't end up using the net, consider it a bonus!

Communicating.

Before the Gathering begins, a WhatsApp group will be set up. To this end, your Chief's Lieutenant will ask for the mobile number of those who wish to be in it. We hope to share stories and photos.
